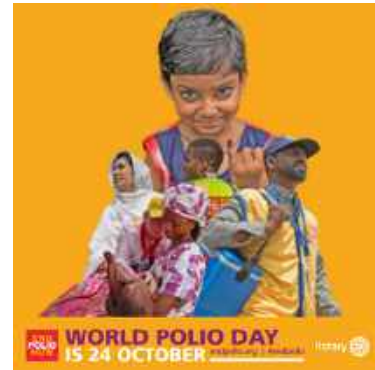

October 24th is World Polio Day!

World Polio Day is a time for Rotarians and Rotaractors across the globe to raise awareness about our work to eradicate polio for good. If we stay committed to making progress, polio will be the second human disease ever to be eradicated.



In our fight to end polio, we've used our collective strength to defeat this devastating disease in almost every part of the world. This year, the World Health Organization's African region was certified free of wild poliovirus – showing that eradication is possible even in very difficult circumstances. Wild poliovirus still paralyzes children in Afghanistan and Pakistan, and as long as polio exists anywhere, it remains a threat everywhere.

Let's Take Action

A polio-free world is possible, but we can achieve it only by taking action together. With the challenges to vaccination programs posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, it's even more crucial that Rotary continues to build awareness and raise funds for polio eradication.

Join the effort to vaccinate children and end polio by organizing a World Polio Day event for your community. In 2019, Rotary members held more than 5,900 events in 136 countries. This year, online events and activities will allow us to expand our reach even more and inspire others to join us.

DGE MESSAGE

From: Joe Schumacker

There have been times in each of our lives where we have felt we were being overrun by change. For many one of these times is now. We are in a period of massive change.

Our lives have been disrupted and there is no indication of when the “new normal” will appear.



Here, amid massive disruption, we have two choices. We can do nothing and accept what happens as fate or we can take action to influence the direction, magnitude, and speed of the change which will come to us.

“Rotary Alive” is the theme for the 2021-2022 District 6990 Governor’s Plan. It is a plan which had its genesis many years ago but is timely in its arrival and is urgently needed. It is not a fix for what is wrong today and it is not dream for a better future. “Rotary Alive” is a plan for shifting Rotary District 6990 to become an organization capable of supporting the mission of Rotary in South Florida, the Florida Keys, and on Grand Bahama Island for the foreseeable future.

“Rotary Alive” is a plan which will come together through the efforts of many. It is a plan which needs to be started now but will never be finished. It is a plan which will evolve over time for it is a living document.

Over the coming months small groups will be working to build **“Rotary Alive”**. The initial plan will be ready to launch at the winter meeting of the District Finance and Procedure (F&P) Committee meeting. Revisions to the plan will begin immediately after launch as we continue to experience the meaning of Rotary in era of COVID.

“Rotary Alive” is built on two fundamental statements: The Vision of Rotary and a living Mission of Rotary.

Vision of Rotary – “Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change – across the globe, in our communities and in ourselves.”

A Living Mission of Rotary – “To serve our communities, develop leaders, and enjoy the fellowship of others.”

“Rotary Alive” will provide us with the opportunity to influence the change we will certainly experience. The initial **“Rotary Alive”** Plan has four pillars: Structure, Process, People, and Engagement. The four pillars support seven key concepts:

- Living vs Legacy
- Strong Operating Line
- Complete District
- Big Tent
- Leadership Pipeline
- Partners in Service
- Partners in Funding



“Rotary Alive” provides the opportunity to create a sustainably successful Rotary experience for all members of District 6990. It is however a tool rather than a machine. ROTARY FLORIDA LICENSE PLATE APPROVED!

We are pleased to announce that State House Bill 1135 providing for the launch of a Florida Rotary License Plate has recently been signed into law by Florida Governor Ron Desantis and becomes effective October 1st!

This project has been in development for years and failed to proceed in the past. Finally with the additional efforts of the Florida Governor Class of 2022-23, the process was finalized and soon efforts for pre-sales of these unique license plates will begin.

We will be providing additional information soon as to how to obtain your own Florida Rotary License Plate, since the law requires that we pre-sell 1000 license plates within 24 months or sooner to enable the state to produce the plates. And we are fortunate to have a Rotarian from District 6990, who owns an Auto Tag Agency, assisting us!

ROTARY GLOBAL SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

There are several opportunities for persons interested in studying abroad funded by The Rotary Foundation. Two well known programs are the Global Grant Scholarships (formerly known as Ambassador Scholarships) and the Peace Fellowships. Rotarians are asked to identify prospective candidates and have them apply through a D6990 Rotary club.

The one-year scholarships are funded up to \$30,000 and more if the district adds to the sum. A bachelor's degree is required. The district will offer one scholarship for academic 2021-2022. For the lower hemisphere departure will be well after the Fall of 2021. Clubs and prospects are directed to rotary.org/en/our-programs/scholarships.

The Peace Fellowships are for up to two years and require the applicant have at least three years of full-time work experience post university degree and be proficient in English. Clubs and prospects are directed to Rotary.org/peace-fellows for details.

Club endorsed applications for scholarships should be mailed to PDG Roy Gonas, chair of the Global Grants Committee roygonas@att.net no later than April 1, 2021. Clubs are encouraged to give a thorough interview of candidates to assure the criteria are met.
